MESSAGE FROM FATHER MIKE



Dear Parishioners,

I would doubt that any members of the parish remain unaware of the recent decision of a Vatican office to ask Cardinal Cupich to reverse his decree to relegate Our Lady of Victory church to

“profane but not sordid use.” You may recall that this unusual phrase is taken from Church (Canon) law, indicating that a church previously blessed and dedicated to divine worship is no longer to be considered “sacred space.” Now, that the previous decision has been reversed, Our Lady of Victory is once again considered to be a site for Catholic worship. The Eucharist may be reserved in the church tabernacle. The liturgy may be celebrated there.

The restored status of the building of Our Lady of Victory church as a house of worship does not alter in any way the status of the three former parishes that were “extinguished” (another unusual term from Canon law) to form Our Lady of the Rosary parish. Our Lady of Victory parish, like the parishes of Saint Pascal and Saint Bartholomew no longer exist. The three parishes were formally ended as individual communities and established as the united community of Our Lady of the Rosary parish. You may recall that the process of selecting the name of the united parish gave a great amount of consideration of our concern for the parishioners of Our Lady of Victory. Both the priests and the people wanted to enshrine the memory and legacy of Our Lady of Victory. Hence, we gratefully recalled that Pope Saint Pius V, to perpetually honor the Naval victory over Turkish forces at Lepanto on October 7, 1571, established the feast of Our Lady of Victory, later interchanging that title with the title of Our Lady of the Rosary. So, the name of our united parish, Our Lady of the Rosary, is forever linked to Our Lady of Victory. In the mind of the sainted Pope who have both titles to the Church, these Marian titles are interchangeable.

MENSAJE DEL PADRE MIKE



Estimados feligreses,

Dudo que algún miembro de la parroquia desconozca la reciente decisión de una oficina del Vaticano de pedirle al cardenal Cupich que revierta su decreto de relegar a la iglesia de Nuestra Señora de la Victoria a un “uso profano, pero no sórdido”. Usted puede recordar que

esta frase inusual está tomada de la ley de la Iglesia (Canon), lo que indica que una iglesia previamente bendecida y dedicada al culto divino ya no debe considerarse “espacio sagrado”. Ahora que la decisión anterior ha sido revertida, Nuestra Señora de la Victoria es considerada una vez más como un sitio para el culto católico. La Eucaristía puede ser reservada en el tabernáculo de la iglesia. La liturgia puede celebrarse allí.

El estado restaurado del edificio de la iglesia de Nuestra Señora de la Victoria como una casa de culto no altera de ninguna manera el estado de las tres antiguas parroquias que fueron “extinguidas” (otro término inusual de la ley canónica) para formar la parroquia de Nuestra Señora del Rosario. La parroquia de Nuestra Señora de la Victoria, al igual que las parroquias de San Pascal y San Bartolomé, ya no existe. Las tres parroquias terminaron como comunidades individuales y se establecieron como la comunidad unida de la parroquia de Nuestra Señora del Rosario. Usted puede recordar que el proceso de selección del nombre de la parroquia unida dio una gran cantidad de consideración de nuestra preocupación por los feligreses de Nuestra Señora de la Victoria. Tanto los sacerdotes como el pueblo querían consagrar la memoria y el legado de Nuestra Señora de la Victoria. Por lo tanto, recordamos con gratitud que el Papa San Pío V, para honrar perpetuamente la victoria naval sobre las fuerzas turcas en Lepanto el 7 de octubre de 1571, estableció la fiesta de Nuestra Señora de la Victoria, intercambiando más tarde ese título con el título de Nuestra Señora del Rosario. Por lo tanto, el nombre de nuestra parroquia unida, Nuestra Señora del Rosario, está ligado para siempre a Nuestra Señora de la Victoria. En la mente del Santo Papa que tiene ambos títulos para la Iglesia, los títulos semarianos son intercambiables.

MESSAGE FROM FATHER MIKE (CONTINUED)

Renew My Church adds a new chapter to the Church's use of the titles of Our Lady of Victory and Our Lady of the Rosary. They were one in the mind of Pope Saint Pius V. They are one in our life as a parish.

The church of Our Lady of Victory has been restored, at least for the time being as one of the houses of worship of Our Lady of the Rosary Parish. As the decree reads, the church is identified as Our Lady of Victory church of Our Lady of the Rosary parish. We are all aware that the Church is primarily the people who worship the Living God as the Mystical Body of Jesus Christ. Only in a secondary sense do we speak "church" as a building used by the people of God when they are at prayer.

Everything everywhere all the time

Thank Saint Athanasius upon reciting the word "consubstantial"—which used to be "one in being with the Father"—the next time you say the Nicene Creed. Athanasius, as deacon, did the theological homework for his bishop, Saint Alexander I, at the Council of Nicea. Together they resisted Arianism. Prior to the council, the central idea of Arianism had been slowly gaining traction among church leaders: that Jesus wasn't God, wasn't co-equal and co-eternal with the Father as taught by the Christian doctrine of the Trinity. As Athanasius insisted of Jesus and the Incarnation, "there is no part of creation deprived of his presence; together with his Father, he fills everything, everywhere, at all times."

What remains is the legacy

Today the church celebrates the feast of two of the 12 apostles, Philip and James, a peculiar pair of martyrs not otherwise associated with one another in Christian history or tradition. James (also called James the Less) is regarded as the first Bishop of Jerusalem, while Philip was said to have preached in Greece, Turkey, and Syria. The pairing of their feast days is related to their shared reliquary in the Church of the Twelve Apostles, following a secret move from the Roman Catacombs. Thereafter lost to history for some time, their relics were rediscovered in the church crypt in the 19th century. On this holy feast, let's all remember the sacrifices of the church's first teachers and model their lives of holiness and faith.

We are a people with a history

When asked to speak at a gathering of the Jewish community in the early days of the church, Paul gives a history lesson. He recounts the liberating activity of God throughout Jewish history and ties God's activity directly to the arrival of Jesus the Messiah and the opening of salvation to all humanity. Our God is the God of history, and our human stories—personal and collective—are part of a much larger historical project of salvation. Play your part in the drama.

Saints and martyrs are the shining lights when it comes to witnessing to Jesus the Christ, often giving their whole lives and their very lives to communicate God's great love. Pope Francis reminds us that "God guides history through the humble courage of those who pray, love, and forgive. There are so many hidden saints, saints who are next-door, hidden witnesses of life, who with little acts of love change history." Next time in prayer, ask God how you've been a hidden witness of God's great love.

Choose your destination

Can someone really be destined, or "predestined," for eternal life? According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, our destiny as beings created by God is eternal life. SACRAMENTAL PREPARATIONS

BAPTISMS: Registration in the parish is a prerequisite. Parents and godparents must attend a Pre-Baptismal Preparation Session with the celebrant two months prior to the Baptism either in person or Zoom. For details regarding baptismal registration and requirements, please contact the parish office or website.

RECONCILIATION: Every Saturday at 9:00 AM to 9:30 AM at Saint Pascal and Saint Bartholomew.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY: Either the bride, the groom, or parent of either must be a registered and active parishioner for at least six months before contacting the parish to make arrangements. For Pre-Marriage Preparation and to secure the wedding date you prefer, please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance before confirming a reception hall. Arrangements can be made at the Parish Office by the bride and groom.

COMMUNION, CONFIRMATION AND CONVERSION:

Children: All children should be enrolled in the Religious Education Program from first through eighth grades, if they are not in a Catholic School.

Adults: Please call the parish office to inquire about RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults).

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK: Anytime a person is facing a serious illness, surgery or hospitalization, it is proper to receive the Sacrament of the Sick. Please contact the parish office. If the office is closed, please leave a message or press option 5.

MINISTRY OF CARE - HOMEBOUND PARISHIONERS:

Please notify the parish office if there is someone you know who is unable to join us at Mass and would like to have the Eucharist brought to their home. Our Ministers of Care bring Holy Communion to those who are sick and homebound.

FUNERALS: When a family member dies, arrangements with the Church are usually made by the Funeral Home. Contact can also be made to the parish directly so priests and bereavement ministers may assist in planning the liturgy for the Funeral Mass, Wake Service and Final Commendation at the cemetery.

FIFTEEN YEARS OR SWEET SIXTEEN: Fifteen-sixteen year old young ladies who would like to celebrate their quinceañera should have been confirmed and received their First Holy Communion as well as a series of preparation for the celebration. Please call Mrs. Maria Arrez at the Office of Religious Education for details.
