MESSAGE FROM FATHER MIKE



Dear Parishioners,

On Saturday, June 3, 2023, Deacon Jesus Gomez, who began serving us as a seminarian at Saint Bartholomew in 2019, was ordained to the priesthood by the Most Reverend Edward J. Wiesenburger, Bishop of Tucson, at Saint Augustine Cathedral in the city and diocese of Tucson. Four other young deacons of the diocese were ordained with Father Gomez in the same ceremony. Of these four, one of the other new priests had completed his studies at our seminary at Mundelein. The other three new priests were sent by the Diocese of Tucson to study at Saint John Seminary, Camarillo, CA, in the Archdiocese of Los Angeles.

I feel particularly blessed to have been invited to participate in the ordination rites that elevated the new Father Gomez to the ministerial priesthood. I was so very grateful to have been asked by the faculty at Mundelein Seminary to oversee Father's field education component of his seminary education, first at Saint Bart's, then, after the unification of our three parishes, at Our Lady of the Rosary. Jesus Gomez truly is a gift to the church, a fine young man who could have had a very happy and successful life in the world, but he chose to give himself completely to the service of the people of God. You played a very important role in the preparation of Father Gomez to the priesthood. He gratefully remembered you and your families in prayers that were offered at his First Mass.

Father Gomez' years of study at Mundelein Seminary were complicated by the challenges of both Renew My Church and the Covid epidemic. But they were also uniquely blessed. Because of the epidemic, many of our meetings for Renew My church, as you recall, needed to be conducted online. Through Microsoft Teams and Zoom, Father Gomez was given a privileged seat from which to view our conversations. I was always grateful to hear his opinions on the matters being discussed. In many ways, he showed himself to be a true mystic eager to serve the pastoral and spiritual needs of people today.

The ordination ceremony of Father Gomez was conducted in both English and Spanish before a full house. Saint Augustine Cathedral seats about 1,000 people, a crowd which overflowed into every conceivable space. The music was elegant, making good use of Spanish and English hymns, as well treasures in Latin from our liturgical heritage.

The following day, Trinity Sunday, Father Gomez offered his first Masses. I was blessed to concelebrate with him, first in English, then in Spanish, at his home parish of Santa Monica in south Tucson. The assembly gathered for the Spanish Mass overflowed the large parish church. Many participated in the Mass from seats that had been set up outside the church. After the Spanish Mass, the parish arranged a reception at the local Catholic high school, San Miguel, located next to Santa Monica's buildings. The Women's Guild of Santa Monica must have fed 500 people, a true Mexican feast, featuring "Carnitas", rice and beans, salad, and plenty of Horchata. Mariachis provided the entertainment.

For me, the experience of the ordination of Father Gomez to the priesthood was a source of inspiration. I was, of course, reminded of my own ordination forty years ago. I am so very grateful for the opportunity to serve you as your priest. I am even more grateful to God that he continues to call new servants to the ministry of the altar, such as Father Gomez and his classmates. I pray that our own parish may send more candidates to prepare for lives of service to the People of God.

MENSAJE DEL PADRE MIKE



Estimados feligreses,

El sábado 3 de junio de 2023, el Diácono Jesús Gómez, quien comenzó a servirnos como seminarista en San Bartolomé en 2019, fue ordenado sacerdote por el Reverendísimo Edward J. Wiesenburger, Obispo de Tucson, en St. Augustine Cathedral en la ciudad y diócesis de Tucson. Otros cuatro jóvenes diáconos de la diócesis fueron ordenados con el Padre Gómez en la misma ceremonia. De estos cuatro, uno de los otros nuevos sacerdotes había completado sus estudios en nuestro seminario en Mundelein. Los otros tres nuevos sacerdotes fueron enviados por la Diócesis de Tucson para estudiar en el Seminario de San Juan, Camarillo, CA, en la Arquidiócesis de Los Ángeles.

Me siento particularmente bendecido de haber sido invitado a participar en los ritos de ordenación que elevaron al nuevo Padre Gómez al sacerdocio ministerial. Estaba muy agradecido de que la facultad del Seminario Mundelein me pidiera que supervisara el componente de educación en la parroquia del Padre de su educación en el seminario, primero en San Bartolomé, luego, después de la unificación de nuestras tres parroquias, en Nuestra Señora del Rosario. Jesús Gómez realmente es un regalo para la iglesia, un buen joven que podría haber tenido una vida muy feliz y exitosa en el mundo. Pero eligió entregarse completamente al servicio del pueblo de Dios. Ustedes jugasteis un papel muy importante en la preparación del Padre Gómez al sacerdocio. El nuevo Padre recordaba con gratitud a ustedes y a sus familias en las oraciones que ofrecieron en su Primera Misa.

Los años de estudio del Padre Gómez en el Seminario Mundelein se complicaron por los desafíos de Renueva Mi Iglesia en la epidemia de Covid. Pero también fueron bendecidos de manera única. Debido a la epidemia, muchas de nuestras reuniones para Renovar Mi Iglesia, como recordarán, necesitaban llevarse a cabo en línea. A través de Microsoft Teams y Zoom, el Padre Gómez recibió un asiento privilegiado desde el cual ver nuestras conversaciones. Siempre estuve agradecido de escuchar sus opiniones sobre los asuntos que se estaban discutiendo. En muchos sentidos, se mostró como un verdadero místico ansioso por servir a las necesidades pastorales y espirituales de las personas de hoy.

La ceremonia de ordenación del Padre Gómez se llevó a cabo en inglés y español ante una casa llena. La Catedral de San Agustín tiene capacidad para unas 1000 personas, una multitud que se desbordó en todos los espacios imaginables. La música era elegante, haciendo buen uso de himnos en español e inglés, así como tesoros en latín de nuestra herencia litúrgica.

Al día siguiente, Domingo de la Trinidad, el padre Gómez ofreció sus primeras misas. Tuve la bendición de concelebrar con él, primero en inglés, luego en español, en su parroquia natal de Santa Mónica en el sur de Tucson. La asamblea reunida para la misa en español desbordó la gran iglesia parroquial. Muchos participaron en la misa desde asientos que se habían establecido fuera de la iglesia. Después de la misa en español, la parroquia organizó una recepción en la escuela secundaria católica local, San Miguel, ubicada al lado de los edificios de Santa Mónica. La Asociación de Las Mujeres Católicas de Santa Mónica debe haber alimentado a 500 personas, una verdadera fiesta mexicana, con "Carnitas", arroz y frijoles, ensalada y mucha horchata. Mariachis proporcionó el entretenimiento.

Para mí, la experiencia de la ordenación del Padre Gómez al sacerdocio fue una fuente de inspiración. Por supuesto, recordé mi propia ordenación hace cuarenta años. Estoy muy agradecido por la oportunidad de servirle como su sacerdote. Estoy aún más agradecido a Dios de que continúe llamando a nuevos siervos al ministerio del altar, como el Padre Gómez y sus compañeros de clase. Ruego que nuestra propia parroquia pueda enviar más candidatos para prepararse para una vida de servicio al Pueblo de Dios.

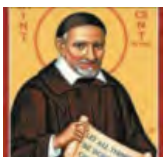

GOSPEL MEDITATION

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Years ago, a woman at daily Mass approached me in the communion procession. She had her arms crossed, indicating she wanted a blessing instead of the Sacred Host. She had tears in her eyes. I gave her a little blessing. She returned the next day. And the next. The same thing repeated. After a few weeks, I asked her why she didn't receive Holy Communion. She said she wasn't Catholic yet and was preparing to become so. I asked her why she wanted to be Catholic. She said, "Because I long to be in a real communion with Christ and with everyone I love." That, I submit, is a darn good reason. A few months later, she became Catholic and received the Body and Blood of Christ with unspeakably great joy and still does to this day.

Saint Paul says of the Eucharistic bread, "Is it not a participation in the body of Christ?" For Paul, the answer is obvious. Yes, it is exactly that. Which is why he can say, "we, though many, are one body." Jesus is truly, really, and substantially present in the Holy Eucharist. This is no magic trick, but a mystery of our salvation. He feeds us with the Sacrament of his body so that our communion with him — and with the other members of his body — is built up and becomes mature. That's why the Eucharist quenches our deep thirst for love and communion. The Body and Blood of Christ is the best reason to be Catholic. It's our participation of love in the one we love.

Jesus was always turning conventional wisdom inside out and upside down—enlightening and enraging people alike. Two thousand years later, we're still trying to figure out how to be happy. If pursuing what the world says “should” make you happy doesn't, take a cue from Jesus and try flipping that faulty logic on its head! .

A troubled land calls for compassion

In an interview with Catholic News Service, Father Ambrose Dobrozsi of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati says that this solemnity, “shows that humanity still needs and longs for a compassionate and all-powerful God. ... In a society where some live in decadence and prideful luxury while others are destitute, the burning love of Christ's Sacred Heart reminds us that the fires of his mercy are also fires of justice.” Consecrate your own heart to the effort to create a more compassionate and just world.

Arrangements can be made at the Parish Office by the bride and groom.

COMMUNION, CONFIRMATION AND CONVERSION:

Children: All children should be enrolled in the Religious Education Program from first through eighth grades, if they are not in a Catholic School.

Adults: Please call the parish office to inquire about RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults).

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK: Anytime a person is facing a serious illness, surgery or hospitalization, it is proper to receive the Sacrament of the Sick. Please contact the parish office. If the office is closed, please leave a message or press option 5.

MINISTRY OF CARE - HOMEBOUND PARISHIONERS:

Please notify the parish office if there is someone you know who is unable to join us at Mass and would like to have the Eucharist brought to their home. Our Ministers of Care bring Holy Communion to those who are sick and homebound.

FUNERALS: When a family member dies, arrangements with the Church are usually made by the Funeral Home. Contact can also be made to the parish directly so priests and bereavement ministers may assist in planning the liturgy for the Funeral Mass, Wake Service and Final Commendation at the cemetery.

FIFTEEN YEARS OR SWEET SIXTEEN: Fifteen-sixteen year old young ladies who would like to celebrate their quinceañera should have been confirmed and received their First Holy Communion as well as a series of preparation for the celebration. Please call Mrs. Maria Arrez at the Office of Religious Education for details.

PRESENTATION OF A CHILD: When your child is 40 days or three years old, he/she may be presented in the church on the First Sunday of any month. Please call the parish office one week ahead to register your child.

GLUTEN FREE HOSTS: If you would like to receive a gluten free host, please notify the priest prior to the beginning of Mass so a gluten free host may be made available for you.
