## MESSAGE FROM FATHER MIKE



Dear Family of Our Lady of the Rosary Parish

Although, at the moment I am writing this communication to you, I have not yet received the formal confirmation that our guests who have been sheltering at Wright College will move to another location, news sources

report that soon our asylum seekers will be given a new shelter. It has been a privilege to be of service to our brothers and sisters who are recent arrivals to our city. In my conversations with many of them, I was deeply moved by their stories about their decision to leave their original homes and journey to our great nation. I was inspired to reflect on similar decisions made by my beloved grandparents and great grandparents to leave behind the problems of the old world and to seek a new beginning for their families, for my family, in a new world. I invite you to join your prayers to mine, asking God to keep our recent guests safe and to establish their families in a safe place where their children may grow in God's grace, in freedom, as they pursue happiness.

I also pray that our guests maintain fond memories of our parish and the generous service of so many parishioners in offering Sunday night hospitality to them after the 6:00 PM Mass in Spanish celebrated at Saint Pascal Church. In particular, I pray that they will fondly remember our Vicar, Bishop Kevin Birmingham and Deacon Jaime Rios leading them, like true shepherds of the flock, down Narragansett Avenue to Saint Pascal. I thank the musicians, the choir, the

ushers, all liturgical ministers, Deacon Victor Uruchima, Deacon Charles Shallcross, Deacon Mike Ahern, Johanna Ortegon, Maria Arrez, Nilma Osiecki , Tony Lopez, Betty Arena, Julie Clancy, and Diego Suarez.

Thanks, too, to Gustavo Lopez, Annette Zelnick, and other parents from PFGA who first brought the situation of the Asylum seekers to our awareness. ## GOSPEL MEDITATION

Our culture seems more polarized and divided than ever. Into this wounded situation, our Catholic faith has a healing remedy to offer: the gift of wisdom. When the Lord offers to give King Solomon anything the monarch desires, he requests "an understanding heart" (1 Kings 3:9). In his polarized situation, the King doesn't ask for power to defeat his enemies. He asks for a wise and understanding heart to judge right from wrong. This wisdom is elevated and fulfilled in Jesus who teaches us to bring forth "both the new and the old" (Matthew 13:52).

In our fractured society, we Christians should stop pining for political power to crush our perceived enemies. That often just makes things worse. Rather, it's much more useful to beg for the grace of true wisdom which transcends both sides of the aisle. This places us in a fresh position from which we can help our culture see what is true and good all across the ideological spectrum. Sometimes we'll look like liberals (e.g., in our love for the poor and marginalized) and other times like conservatives (e.g., in our sexual ethics and views on religious freedom). Because this wisdom is free from ideological narrowness, it will help to heal these painful fractures. Lord Jesus, this week, pour into us your healing wisdom.



They will check the abdominal aorta which is the main artery off the heart for aneurysms, the thyroid which controls the metabolism for cyst, nodules and enlargements, the liver, gallbladder and both kidney's for cyst, masses, fluid build-up and tumors.

These screenings are typically NOT performed at annual check-ups, nor will insurance companies pay for them unless you are symptomatic. Collectively, these screenings cost thousands. Stroke Scan will be offering them to you for \$169 for all 7 combined. Health/Flex Savings Accounts are accepted. Please call 866-935-7226 to schedule an appointment today. Prevention is the KEY to early detection.

Stroke Scan Plus organizará un examen de ultrasonido vascular, vascular y abdominal en la Iglesia Católica de San Bartolomé el viernes 11 de agosto de 2023 Y en la Iglesia Católica de San Pascual el jueves 17 de agosto de 2023.

Revisarán las arterias carótidas en ambos lados del cuello para detectar la acumulación de placa grasa, que representa el 80% de todos los accidentes cerebrovasculares.

Revisan la aorta abdominal, que es la arteria principal del corazón en busca de aneurismas, la tiroides que controla el metabolismo de quistes, nódulos y agrandamientos, el hígado, la vesícula biliar y ambos riñones para quistes, masas, acumulación de líquido y tumores.

Estos exámenes generalmente NO se realizan en chequeos anuales, ni las compañías de seguros pagarán por ellos a menos que usted sea sintomático. En conjunto, estas proyecciones cuestan miles. ## QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

**Question:**

Why do priests kiss the altar at the start of Mass

**Answer:**

Our churches and chapels are filled with symbols. We might think of the more common symbols (like the crucifix, statues, stained-glass windows, vestment color and altar cloths) as well as major symbols (such as the paschal candle and the baptismal font). But there are some things that we can take for granted in our sacred spaces, because unfortunately, they seem to just be part of the building, including three of the main symbols of our liturgy: the ambo (lectern), the chair for the priest celebrant, and the altar.

These three objects are placed in a specially designated area called the sanctuary. They are the places where the Word of God is proclaimed, where the priest prays and presides at the celebration, and where the bread and wine are offered by the priest during the Eucharistic Prayer. Although each of these objects is sacred because of the role they play in our worship, the altar holds a special place. In a document containing the rules and instructions for the Mass — the “General Instruction of the Roman Missal” — we read: “The altar on which the Sacrifice of the Cross is made present under sacramental signs is also the table of the Lord to which the People of God are called together to participate in the Mass, as well as the center of the thanksgiving that is accomplished throughout the Eucharist” (no. 296).

One of the ways that we recognize the importance of the altar is when the priest and deacon kiss the altar at the beginning of Mass. Kissing is an ancient act of devotion. Remember, we also kiss the cross on Good Friday, and the deacon or priest kisses the “Book of the Gospels” after the Gospel is proclaimed. This act of devotion reminds us that the altar is a symbol of Jesus, the “living stone” (see 1 Peter 2:4), the foundation stone of our faith. It is a symbol gesture, but it is a powerful reminder of the One on whom our faith is built and in whose name we gather as the “household of faith” (see Galatians 6:10).

## PREGUNTAS Y RESPUESTAS

**Pregunta:**

¿Por qué los sacerdotes besan el altar al comienzo de la Misa?

**Respuesta:**

Nuestras iglesias y capillas están llenas de símbolos. Podríamos pensar en los símbolos más comunes (como el crucifijo, las estatuas, las vidrieras, el color de las vestiduras y los manteles del altar), así como en los símbolos principales (como el cirio pascual y la pila bautismal). Pero hay algunas cosas que podemos pasar por desapercibidos en nuestros espacios sagrados, porque desafortunadamente parecen ser solo parte del edificio, incluidos tres de los símbolos principales de nuestra liturgia: el ambón (atril), la silla para el sacerdote celebrante y el altar.

Estos tres objetos se colocan en un área especialmente designada llamada santuario. Son los lugares donde se proclama la Palabra de Dios, donde el sacerdote ora y preside la celebración, y donde el pan y el vino son ofrecidos por el sacerdote durante la Plegaria Eucarística. Aunque cada uno de estos objetos es sagrado por el papel que juegan en nuestra adoración, el altar ocupa un lugar especial. En un documento que contiene las reglas e instrucciones para la Misa —la “Instrucción General del Misal Romano”— leemos: “El altar en el que se hace presente el Sacrificio de la Cruz bajo los signos sacramentales es también la mesa del Señor a la que el Pueblo de Dios está llamado a participar en la Misa, así como el centro de la acción de gracias que se realiza a lo largo de la Eucaristía” (n. 296).

Una de las formas en que reconocemos la importancia del altar es cuando el sacerdote y el diácono besan el altar al comienzo de la Misa. Besar es un antiguo acto de devoción. Recuerda, también besamos la cruz el Viernes Santo, y el diácono o el sacerdote besa el “Libro de los Evangelios” después de proclamar el Evangelio. Este acto de devoción nos recuerda que el altar es un símbolo de Jesús, la “piedra viva” (ver 1 Pedro 2:4), la piedra fundamental de nuestra fe. Es un gesto simbólico, pero es un poderoso recordatorio de Aquel sobre quien se basa nuestra fe y en cuyo nombre nos reunimos como la “familia de la fe” (ver Gálatas 6:10).

Spanish priest Ignatius of Loyola founded the Society of Jesus (along with Saints Peter Faber and Francis Xavier) in Paris in 1541. Members of this religious order are known as Jesuits. Today, the Jesuits are the largest male religious order in the church, and Pope Francis is the first Jesuit pope. The term Jesuit was originally meant as an insult, meaning "someone who too frequently used the name of Jesus." Ignatius never used the term, but members later embraced it with positive meaning. After all, how could anyone use the name of Jesus too much? Take a cue from the Jesuits and don't hold back! .

## Tuesday, August 1, 2023

### Our saving grace

Alphonsus gave us much, but perhaps the greatest gift was his fight against the Jansenist heresy, encapsulated in his 1748 volume Moral Theology. Thanks to Alphonsus, Catholicism has been able to steer a middle path between a darkly pessimistic view of human worth on the one hand and moral laxity on the other. Jansenists held an extreme view of original sin, believing only some are pre-ordained for salvation, saying grace had little chance of saving the rest—even through the sacrament of Reconciliation. Alphonsus encourages us to trust and use the sacrament, but also to "acquire the habit of speaking to God as if you were alone with Him, familiarly and with confidence and love, as to the dearest and most loving of friends."

For Pre-Marriage Preparation and to secure the wedding date you prefer, please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance before confirming a reception hall. Arrangements can be made at the Parish Office by the bride and groom.

### COMMUNION, CONFIRMATION AND CONVERSION:

**Children:** All children should be enrolled in the Religious Education Program from first through eighth grades, if they are not in a Catholic School.

**Adults:** Please call the parish office to inquire about RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults).

**SACRAMENT OF THE SICK:** Anytime a person is facing a serious illness, surgery or hospitalization, it is proper to receive the Sacrament of the Sick. Please contact the parish office. If the office is closed, please leave a message or press option 5.

### MINISTRY OF CARE - HOMEBOUND PARISHIONERS:

Please notify the parish office if there is someone you know who is unable to join us at Mass and would like to have the Eucharist brought to their home. Our Ministers of Care bring Holy Communion to those who are sick and homebound.

**FUNERALS:** When a family member dies, arrangements with the Church are usually made by the Funeral Home. Contact can also be made to the parish directly so priests and bereavement ministers may assist in planning the liturgy for the Funeral Mass, Wake Service and Final Commendation at the cemetery.

**FIFTEEN YEARS OR SWEET SIXTEEN:** Fifteen-sixteen year old young ladies who would like to celebrate their quinceanera should have been confirmed and received their First Holy Communion as well as a series of preparation for the celebration. Please call Mrs. Maria Arrez at the Office of Religious Education for details.

**PRESENTATION OF A CHILD:** When your child is 40 days or three years old, he/she may be presented in the church on the First Sunday of any month. Please call the parish office one week ahead to register your child.

**FUNERALES:** Cuando un miembro de la familia muere, los arreglos con la Iglesia generalmente son hechos por la Funeraria. También se puede hacer contacto con la parroquia directamente para que los sacerdotes y los ministros de duelo puedan ayudar en la planificación de la liturgia para la Misa Funeral, el Servicio de Velatorio y la Encomienda Final en el cementerio.

**QUINCE AÑOS O DULCES DIECISÉIS:** Las jóvenes de dieciséis o quince años que deseen celebrar su quinceañera deberán haber sido Confirmadas y haber recibido su Primera Comunión, así como una serie de preparación para la celebración. Por favor llame a la Sra. María Arrez en la Oficina de Educación Religiosa para más detalles.

**PRESENTACIÓN DE UN NIÑO:** Cuando su hijo tiene 40 días o tres años de edad, él / ella puede ser presentado en la iglesia el primer domingo de cualquier mes. Por favor llame a la oficina parroquial una semana antes para registrar a su hijo.

**HOSTIAS SIN GLUTEN:** Si desea recibir la hostia sin gluten, notifique al sacerdote antes del comienzo de la Misa para que la hostia sin gluten pueda estar disponible para usted.
