MESSAGE FROM FATHER MIKE



Dear Parishioners

As we continue to build our new reality as a united parish, we find so many reasons to give thanks for the grace of God at work in the life of our community. We find the numbers of those who are returning for Mass after the lockdowns associated with Covid continue to increase. A preliminary review of our annual October count is most encouraging. Similarly, the number of baptisms in our united parish is very impressive. Since the official launch of Our Lady of the Rosary Parish on July 1, 2021, we have baptized 303 new Catholics.

We are also blessed with many parishioners who out of devotion to our Blessed Mother or for other reasons enjoy participating in Mass on Saturday mornings. At both of our churches, a significant number of our faithful gather for Mass and then take advantage of the opportunity to go to confession after Mass. Unfortunately, the number of priests available to offer the Saturday morning Mass and to hear confessions after Mass is not as encouraging. Sometimes, it is very difficult to find a priest for the morning Masses, as well as confessions, and the two evening Masses. Hence, we have decided to alter our Saturday morning schedule so, if need be, I can be at both churches for Mass and confessions. This will require some patience and flexibility on the part of our parishioners.

As of the first weekend of December, which corresponds with the first weekend of Advent and the beginning of the new liturgical year, Saturday morning at Our Lady of the Rosary Parish will be structured as follows:

At Saint Pascal Church, Mass at 8:30 AM in English, followed by Confessions from 9:00 AM to 9:30 PM

At Saint Bartholomew Church, Mass at 11:30 AM in Spanish, followed by Confessions from 12:00 PM-12:30 PM

We hope to be able to provide confessors at both churches who are able to hear confessions in both English and Spanish at the appointed times.

Funeral Masses on Saturdays may need to be scheduled at either church at 10:00 AM. Special events, such as Presentations or the anniversary of a loved one's death may need to be scheduled at one of the regular Saturday morning or Sunday liturgies. Weddings and Quinceanera liturgies at both churches may need to be celebrated at 2:00 PM.

For now, the Saturday evening Masses, 4:00 PM in English at Saint Pascal and 4:30 PM in English at Saint Bartholomew will remain as scheduled. However, securing the services of priests to offer these Masses becomes an ever-greater challenge. We may need to review our offerings for Saturday evening in the near future.

As always, I welcome your thoughts on the new schedule for Saturdays.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Question: Why do some sacraments leave a character or mark on the soul? Don't all sacraments affect the soul?

Answer: All sacraments mediate grace and connect us to Christ and to the Church. Some sustain us in our faith journey, while others help us heal from the effects of sin. Each one offers a share in God's life, giving us what we need to be faithful followers of Jesus. But some sacraments change us in ways that are irreversible. The three sacraments that leave a character are Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Orders. We are literally different people because of the effect of the grace of those sacraments. We are changed at the core of our being in such a fundamental way that we can not go back to what we once were.

In Baptism, we are freed from original sin, initiated into the Body of Christ as adopted sons and daughters. In Confirmation, we are given the fullness of God's Spirit, sealed in his grace and gifted with what we need to live a Christian life. In Holy Orders, a priest is marked as an 'alter Christus,' another Christ, and is once and forever a priest who offers sacrifice, forgives sin, and acts in the person of Christ. In these three sacraments, we are conformed more closely to Christ, reflecting his love and truth.

MENSAJE DEL PADRE MIKE



Queridos feligreses:

A medida que continuamos construyendo nuestra nueva realidad como una parroquia unida, encontramos muchas razones para dar gracias por la gracia de Dios obrando en la vida de nuestra comunidad. Encontramos que el número de personas que regresan a misa después de los cierres asociados con Covid continúa aumentando. Una revisión preliminar de nuestro conteo anual de octubre es muy alentadora. Del mismo modo, el número de bautismos en nuestra parroquia unida es muy impresionante. Desde el lanzamiento oficial de la Parroquia Nuestra Señora del Rosario el 1 de julio de 2021, hemos bautizado a 303 nuevos católicos.

También hemos sido bendecidos con muchos feligreses que, por devoción a nuestra Santísima Madre o por otras razones, disfrutaban de participar en la Misa los sábados por la mañana. En nuestras dos iglesias, un número significativo de nuestros fieles se reúnen para la Misa y luego aprovechan la oportunidad para confesarse después de la Misa. Desafortunadamente, el número de sacerdotes disponibles para ofrecer la Misa del sábado por la mañana y escuchar confesiones después de la Misa no es tan alentador. A veces, es muy difícil encontrar un sacerdote para las misas de la mañana, así como para las confesiones y las dos misas de la tarde. Por lo tanto, hemos decidido alterar nuestro horario de los sábados por la mañana para que, si es necesario, pueda estar en ambas iglesias para la misa y las confesiones. Esto requerirá un poco de paciencia y flexibilidad por parte de nuestros feligreses.

A partir del primer fin de semana de diciembre, que corresponde al primer fin de semana de Adviento y al comienzo del nuevo año litúrgico, el sábado por la mañana en la parroquia de Nuestra Señora del Rosario se estructurará de la siguiente manera:

En la Iglesia de San Pascal, Misa de 8:30 AM en inglés, seguida de confesiones de 9:00 AM a 9:30 PM.

En la Iglesia de San Bartolomé, Misa de las 11:30 AM en español, seguida de confesiones de 12:00 PM a 12:30 PM.

Esperamos poder proporcionar confesores en ambas iglesias que puedan escuchar confesiones tanto en inglés como en español en los horarios señalados.

Es posible que las misas fúnebres de los sábados deban programarse en cualquiera de las iglesias a las 10:00 AM. Es posible que sea necesario programar eventos especiales, como presentaciones o el aniversario de la muerte de un ser querido, en una de las liturgias regulares de los sábados por la mañana. Es posible que las bodas y liturgias de quinceañera en ambas iglesias deban celebrarse a las 2:00 PM.

Por ahora, las misas de los sábados por la noche, a las 4:00 PM en inglés en St. Pascal y a las 4:30 PM en inglés en St. Bartholomew, permanecerán según lo programado. Sin embargo, asegurar los servicios de sacerdotes para ofrecer estas misas se convierte en un desafío. Es posible que tengamos que revisar nuestro programa de las misas de la noche del sábado en un futuro próximo.

Como siempre, agradezco sus opiniones sobre el nuevo horario de los sábados.

PREGUNTAS Y RESPUESTAS

Pregunta: ¿Por qué algunos sacramentos dejan un carácter o marca en el alma? ¿No afectan todos los sacramentos al alma?

Respuesta: Todos los sacramentos median la gracia y nos conectan con Cristo y con la Iglesia. Algunos nos sostienen en nuestro viaje de fe, mientras que otros nos ayudan a sanar de los efectos del pecado. Cada uno ofrece una participación en la vida de Dios, dándonos lo que necesitamos para ser fieles seguidores de Jesús. Pero algunos sacramentos nos cambian de maneras que son irreversibles. Los tres sacramentos que imprimen carácter son el Bautismo, la Confirmación y el Orden Sagrado. Somos literalmente personas diferentes por el efecto de la gracia de esos sacramentos. Somos cambiados en el centro de nuestro ser de una manera tan fundamental que no podemos volver a ser lo que una vez fuimos.

En el Bautismo somos liberados del pecado original, iniciados en el Cuerpo de Cristo como hijos e hijas adoptivos. En la Confirmación, recibimos la plenitud del Espíritu de Dios, sellados en su gracia y dotados con lo que necesitamos para vivir una vida cristiana. En las Órdenes Sagradas, un sacerdote está marcado como un 'alter Christus', otro Cristo, y es una vez y para siempre un sacerdote que ofrece sacrificio, perdona el pecado y actúa en la persona de Cristo. En estos tres sacramentos nos conformamos más estrechamente a Cristo, reflejando su amor y su verdad.

V. Henriette DeLille

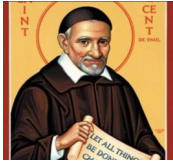

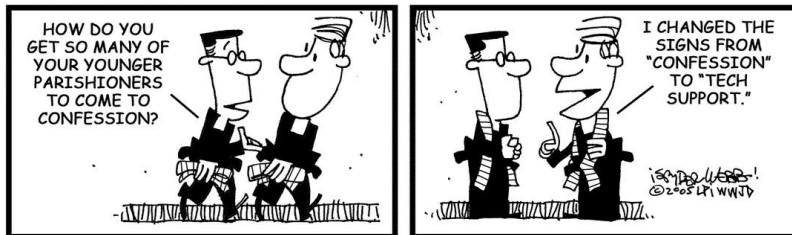

GOSPEL MEDITATION



Last Easter season a new convert to Catholicism at my parish asked me with a grave tone in her voice: “Why do we call priests ‘father’ if Jesus says, ‘Call no man on earth your father, for you have one Father, who is in

heaven?’” Thinking myself clever, I asked, “Do you think it’s okay to call someone your ‘teacher’ or ‘mister’ or ‘dad’?” She said, “Yes, I do.” I responded, “Well, Jesus seems to forbid that, too. So, it’s obviously hyperbole that he’s using.” She thought for a moment and declared, “Then I will stop using those words, too!” And she walked away. Not the outcome I was seeking.

We shouldn’t be too hasty in dismissing this complaint voiced by many non-Catholics. The expression “father” for ordained priests is not honorary for the individual man. The priest’s fatherhood doesn’t begin or end in him at all. Rather, the title “father” indicates that he is a sacramental sign of God’s Fatherhood revealed in Jesus. I can tell you, as a very unworthy bearer of that title, we should give and receive that title with some trepidation (because of God’s awesomeness) and with a little sense of humor (because of the lowliness of the men with the title).

The longer I’m a priest, the more I’m comfortable with people not using the title “father” and just calling me “John.” After all, only God is Father in the truest sense. At the same time, Jesus has brought the Father close to us, very close. We honor this closeness in some men with the title “father.” Who are the priests in your life whom Christ has sent to you? How wonderful that Christ has surrounded us with humble signs of his Father’s love. It’s good to celebrate that love with gratitude for the priests in our lives.

After a letter from local segregationist Catholics to the pope was rebuffed by the holy father, Rummel declared all parochial schools desegregated in 1962. Famously, he later excommunicated several vocal holdouts who protested his move. Where is such decisive action against racism among bishops today? We are all responsible for opposing injustice. How will you act for the common good?

Thursday, November 09, 2023 Let the good times roll

We're Catholics have lots of words with their own twists, and one of them is "feast." While we don't all sit down to a giant meal for every "feast," in some corner of the world, Catholics may well be doing just that. In church language, "feast" means something special is celebrated on a particular day. Feasts range from the death days of saints, to events in Jesus' life, to the foundation of a church with a special history (such as today's feast of the Lateran Basilica). Many feasts have special followings in particular cultures. Let feast days remind you that sometimes devotion also calls for a good party!

Known for his accessible preaching style, Pope Leo I helped his fifth-century flock and Christians down through the ages understand more fully the true nature of Christ and his saving gifts. By becoming human, explains Leo, "Jesus assumed the form of a servant without the stain of sin—enhancing what was human, not detracting from what was divine." As children of the light, we share in God's own nature. Therefore, our heads and hearts should reflect this holy inheritance. Or put simply by Leo: "Christian, remember your dignity."

Saturday, November 11, 2023 A veteran worthy of his day.

Because Saint Martin of Tours (c. 320-397) was the son of a Roman army officer, he was required by law to serve in the Roman military. Two years after his conversion to Christianity he announced, "I am the soldier of Christ: it is not lawful for me to fight." He was arrested and charged with cowardice. So he volunteered to go into battle unarmed. Before he could make good on his offer, he was discharged from the military. This Veterans Day, we can remember those, like Saint Martin and Venerable Emil Kapaun, Army chaplain, who, for the sake of Christ, go into battle armed only with the love of Christ.

MEMORIAL OF MARTIN OF TOURS, BISHOP TODAY'S READINGS: Romans 16:3-9, 16, 22-27; Luke 16:9-15 (490).

SACRAMENTAL PREPARATIONS

BAPTISMS: Registration in the parish is a prerequisite. Children: All children should be enrolled in the Religious Education Program from first through eighth grades, if they are not in a Catholic School.

Adults: Please call the parish office to inquire about RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults).

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK: Anytime a person is facing a serious illness, surgery or hospitalization, it is proper to receive the Sacrament of the Sick. Please contact the parish office. If the office is closed, please leave a message or press option 5.

MINISTRY OF CARE - HOMEBOUND PARISHIONERS:

Please notify the parish office if there is someone you know who is unable to join us at Mass and would like to have the Eucharist brought to their home. Our Ministers of Care bring Holy Communion to those who are sick and homebound.

FUNERALS: When a family member dies, arrangements with the Church are usually made by the Funeral Home. Contact can also be made to the parish directly so priests and bereavement ministers may assist in planning the liturgy for the Funeral Mass, Wake Service and Final Commendation at the cemetery.

FIFTEEN YEARS OR SWEET SIXTEEN: Fifteen-sixteen year old young ladies who would like to celebrate their quinceañera should have been confirmed and received their First Holy Communion as well as a series of preparation for the celebration. Please call Mrs. Maria Arrez at the Office of Religious Education for details.

PRESENTATION OF A CHILD: When your child is 40 days or three years old, he/she may be presented in the church on the First Sunday of any month. Please call the parish office one week ahead to register your child.

GLUTEN FREE HOSTS: If you would like to receive a gluten free host, please notify the priest prior to the beginning of Mass so a gluten free host may be made available for you.
