MESSAGE FROM FATHER MIKE



The Migrant Crisis and the Catholic Church in Chicago

Dear Parishioners:

In a recent article in "The Chicago Catholic", Cardinal Blase Cupich, Archbishop of Chicago, speaks of the humanitarian crisis created by the arrival of thousand of migrants who have arrived at our southern borders. As you may know, many of the new arrivals, though certainly not all, have arrived from Venezuela and identify as Catholics. Regardless of the faith professed by the most recent arrivals to the United States, the Cardinal notes that the basic human needs of all migrants must be the concern of the Church. One day, each one of us will stand before the Judge of the living and the dead, who has already given us warning that among the criteria of judgment will be the welcome that we give to strangers in our land.

In the Cardinal's article, our archbishop states clearly that the decisions and policies governing our nation's borders are subject to the rule of law that is administered by those with competent authority. But the Church must always respond to the demands of the law of charity, in each situation. One day, we will stand before the one who will decide, in part, if we the care we offered those in need during our lives is worthy of heaven.

Cardinal Cupich observes:

Since fall 2022, Catholic Charities has been working closely with parishes, community partners, the State of Illinois and City of Chicago to respond with compassion to more than 4,000 new arrivals crossing our borders from Central and South America. In fact, Catholic Charities has been asked by the Illinois Department of Human Services to join the state's initiative to transition families out of shelters into stable housing.

With the support of Catholic Charities:

- More than 700 people have been reunited with loved ones in other states,
- About 2,000 people have moved out of shelters and into apartments,
- An additional 2,300 people will soon transition from shelters to apartments,
- Seven parishes are accompanying 23 families in their resettlement and integration into their new community, and
- More than 200 new arrivals join community suppers five days a week at Catholic Charities' 721 N. LaSalle building, with more in the suburbs, in partnership with local parishes and supported by volunteers.

Just this week I received a call from Bishop Daniel Flores of Brownsville, Texas, asking for us to help 100 people traveling by bus to Chicago to reunite with family members here.

While all the help Catholic Charities provides remains impressive, there is more to do, given that:

- Since last August, some 8,100 migrants have arrived in Chicago and the influx is increasing.

I ask you to bring the information provided by the Cardinal to your time in prayer. Invite the Holy Spirit to guide you in your response to the situation of the migrants who are new arrivals in Chicago. Perhaps, the Holy Spirit will move you to offer financial support to Catholic Charities. You can donate to Catholic Charities through their website or bringing an offering to them through our parish. We will forward your donation to Catholic Charities.

Should the Holy Spirit move you to suggest other actions that we, as a parish community, might undertake, kindly inform me. I would happily welcome your insight.

MENSAJE DEL PADRE MIKE



La crisis migratoria y la Iglesia Católica en Chicago

Estimados feligreses:

En un artículo reciente en "The Chicago Catholic", el cardenal Blase Cupich, arzobispo de Chicago, habla de la crisis humanitaria creada por la llegada de miles de migrantes que han llegado a nuestras fronteras del sur. Como sabrán, muchos de los recién llegados, aunque ciertamente no todos, han llegado de Venezuela y se identifican como católicos. Independientemente de la fe profesada por los recién llegados a los Estados Unidos, el cardenal señala que las necesidades humanas básicas de todos los migrantes deben ser la preocupación de la Iglesia. Un día, cada uno de nosotros comparecerá ante el Juez de los vivos y de los muertos, quien ya nos ha advertido que entre los criterios de juicio estará la bienvenida que damos a los extranjeros en nuestra tierra.

En el artículo del Cardenal, nuestro arzobispo afirma claramente que las decisiones y políticas que rigen las fronteras de nuestra nación están sujetas al estado de derecho que es administrado por aquellos con autoridad competente. Pero la Iglesia debe responder siempre a las exigencias de la ley de la caridad, en cada situación. Un día, nos presentaremos ante Aquel que decidirá, en parte, si el cuidado que ofrecimos a los necesitados durante nuestras vidas es digno del cielo.

El cardenal Cupich observa:

Desde el otoño de 2022, Caridades Católicas ha estado trabajando estrechamente con parroquias, socios comunitarios, el Estado de Illinois y la Ciudad de Chicago para responder con compasión a más de 4,000 recién llegados que cruzan nuestras fronteras desde América Central y del Sur. De hecho, el Departamento de Servicios Humanos de Illinois le ha pedido a Caridades Católicas que se una a la iniciativa del estado para hacer la transición de las familias de los refugios a una vivienda estable.

Con el apoyo de Caridades Católicas:

- Más de 700 personas se han reunido con sus seres queridos en otros estados,
- unas 2.000 personas se han mudado de los refugios a apartamentos,
- Otras 2.300 personas pronto pasarán de refugios a apartamentos,
- siete parroquias acompañan a 23 familias en su reasentamiento e integración en su nueva comunidad, y
- Más de 200 recién llegados se unen a cenas comunitarias cinco días a la semana en el edificio 721 N. LaSalle de Caridades Católicas, con más en los suburbios, en asociación con parroquias locales y con el apoyo de voluntarios.

Justo esta semana recibí una llamada del obispo Daniel Flores de Brownsville, Texas, pidiéndonos que ayudemos a 100 personas que viajan en autobús a Chicago para reunirse con familiares aquí.

Si bien toda la ayuda que brinda Caridades Católicas sigue siendo impresionante, hay más por hacer, dado que:

- Desde agosto pasado, unos 8.100 migrantes han llegado a Chicago y la afluencia está aumentando.

Os pido que llevéis la información proporcionada por el cardenal a vuestro tiempo de oración. Invita al Espíritu Santo a guiarte en tu respuesta a la situación de los migrantes recién llegados a Chicago. Tal vez, el Espíritu Santo lo moverá a ofrecer apoyo financiero a Caridades Católicas. Puede donar a Caridades Católicas a través de su sitio web o llevarles una ofrenda a través de nuestra parroquia. Enviaremos su donación a Caridades Católicas.

Si el Espíritu Santo te mueve a sugerir otras acciones que nosotros, como comunidad parroquial, podamos emprender, por favor infórmame. Con mucho gusto agradecería su opinión.



"Art is neither a profession nor a hobby, it is a way of being," he said. Take inspiration to creatively express your spirituality in your own way of being.

One Bread, one body

A painting by Flemish artist Peter Paul Rubens—called The Defenders of the Eucharist—includes a serene Saint Norbert, his white robes wrapped around a ciborium (the cup that holds the consecrated Eucharist) as he cradles the Blessed Sacrament. Norbert founded the Norbertine religious order as well as the first Third Order for laypeople embracing the spirit of religious life. And, as a successful peacemaker, he's often depicted with an olive branch. But Norbert's preaching about the Blessed Sacrament, convincing entire villages to reclaim their lost belief in the Real Presence—also having eucharistic miracles happen on his watch—has earned him the title "Apostle of the Blessed Sacrament." May he inspire our devotion as the National Eucharistic Revival enters its second phase this month.

Transcending prejudice in service to G

This day marks the 105th death anniversary of Servant of God Julia Greeley, one of seven African-American Catholics on the path to sainthood. She is one of two such candidates born into slavery in Ralls County, Missouri during the mid-19th century, alongside Venerable Augustus Tolton. Freed during the Civil War, she emigrated to Colorado with her employer and became a Catholic due to their influence. There she would become known as "Denver's Angel of Charity" despite her own poverty, assisting the destitute at night so as not to offend her white beneficiaries. She died in 1918 and was the first and only Catholic layperson to lay in repose in the city—later becoming the first buried in the cathedral. May her legacy of service live on in all of us

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK: Anytime a person is facing a serious illness, surgery or hospitalization, it is proper to receive the Sacrament of the Sick. Please contact the parish office. If the office is closed, please leave a message or press option 5.

MINISTRY OF CARE - HOMEBOUND PARISHIONERS:

Please notify the parish office if there is someone you know who is unable to join us at Mass and would like to have the Eucharist brought to their home. Our Ministers of Care bring Holy Communion to those who are sick and homebound.

FUNERALS: When a family member dies, arrangements with the Church are usually made by the Funeral Home. Contact can also be made to the parish directly so priests and bereavement ministers may assist in planning the liturgy for the Funeral Mass, Wake Service and Final Commendation at the cemetery.

FIFTEEN YEARS OR SWEET SIXTEEN: Fifteen-sixteen year old young ladies who would like to celebrate their quinceañera should have been confirmed and received their First Holy Communion as well as a series of preparation for the celebration. Please call Mrs. Maria Arrez at the Office of Religious Education for details.


