

MESSAGE FROM FATHER MIKE

On Saturday, October 7, we celebrate our patronal feast, the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. As noted in last week's bulletin, we also celebrate the Feast of Our Lady of Victory. To commemorate the Christian victory over the Ottoman Turks in the naval battle of Lepanto, Pope St. Pius V created an annual feast to honor Our Lady on October 7 to thank her for her intercession on behalf of the Christians. He gave to this feast the title of Our Lady of Victory. However, because Saint Pius believed that Our Blessed Mother acted on behalf of the Christians because they were praying the rosary, he interchanged the titles of Our Lady of Victory and Our Lady of the Rosary. Ever since, the Church has felt free to follow his example. Since the sixteenth century, the Church has freely interchanged the use of the titles.

As Catholic writers have noted throughout the years, the rosary of Our Lady has been a popular, Scripturally based set of prayers invoking Mary's intercession since the Middle Ages. The most widely accepted account of the rosary's origins tells us that Our Blessed Mother herself revealed to Saint Dominic de Guzman the rosary when he found himself unsettled with the results of his preaching campaign among the Albigensian heretics in the early 13th century. According to this tradition, Our Lady gave the rosary as a kind of popular psalter to bring the blessings of scriptural meditation into the daily lives of even the least educated of God's people. History confirms that Saint Dominic met with great success in his preaching once he began spreading this devotion. Because the earliest recording of the story of the private apparition of Our Lady to Saint Dominic dates from three hundred years after the event allegedly took place, its accuracy has been challenged over the years. But it is true that the rosary grew in prominence in popular piety through the protection and support of Dominic and his Dominican friars.

Why is the rosary such a fitting Marian devotion? In its essence, the rosary is a marriage of scriptural meditation and formulaic, repetitive prayers, whose aim is to facilitate the prayer practitioner's contemplation of the events of Salvation history narrated in Scripture. The prayers and their accompanying mysteries allow those who pray them to meditate on the events of salvation history that occurred in the lives of Jesus and Mary. Our prayerful contemplation of God's actions as we pray the rosary enables us to imitate Mary's disposition of openness to God's will (Lk 1:38) and continual pondering of God's actions in her life (Lk 2:19). Thus, the rosary is the Marian devotion par excellence, as it aims to instill in us the very disposition of Mary, as we meet her in the Gospel and in our prayer.

May we honor our heavenly patron, Our Blessed Lady of the Rosary, who is Our Lady of Victory, by a renewed dedication to daily use of the rosary in our prayer.

MENSAJE DEL PADRE MIKE

El sábado 7 de octubre celebramos nuestra fiesta patronal, la Fiesta de Nuestra Señora del Rosario. Como se señaló en el boletín de la semana pasada, también celebramos la fiesta de Nuestra Señora de la Victoria. Para conmemorar la victoria cristiana sobre los turcos otomanos en la batalla naval de Lepanto, el Papa San Pío V creó una fiesta anual para honrar a Nuestra Señora el 7 de octubre para agradecerle su intercesión en nombre de los cristianos. Le dio a esta fiesta el título de Nuestra Señora de la Victoria. Sin embargo, debido a que San Pío creía que Nuestra Santísima Madre actuaba en nombre de los cristianos porque estaban rezando el rosario, intercambió los títulos de Nuestra Señora de la Victoria y Nuestra Señora del Rosario. Desde entonces, la Iglesia se ha sentido libre de seguir su ejemplo. Desde el siglo XVI, la Iglesia ha intercambiado libremente el uso de los títulos.

Como los escritores católicos han señalado a lo largo de los años, el rosario de Nuestra Señora ha sido un conjunto popular de oraciones basadas en las Escrituras que invocan la intercesión de María desde la Edad Media. El relato más ampliamente aceptado de los orígenes del rosario nos dice que Nuestra Santísima Madre misma reveló a Santo Domingo de Guzmán el rosario cuando se encontró inquieto con los resultados de su campaña de predicación entre los herejes albigenses a principios del siglo 13. Según esta tradición, Nuestra Señora dio el rosario como una especie de salterio popular para llevar las bendiciones de la meditación bíblica a la vida cotidiana incluso del pueblo de Dios menos educado. La historia confirma que Santo Domingo tuvo gran éxito en su predicación una vez que comenzó a difundir esta devoción. Aunque la primera grabación de la historia de la aparición privada de Nuestra Señora a Santo Domingo data de trescientos años después de que supuestamente tuvo lugar el evento, su precisión ha sido cuestionada con el tiempo. Pero es cierto que el rosario creció en prominencia en la piedad popular a través de la protección y el apoyo de Domingo y su orden dominicano.

¿Por qué el rosario es una devoción mariana tan apropiada? En su esencia, el rosario es un matrimonio de meditación bíblica y oraciones repetitivas y formulistas, cuyo objetivo es facilitar la contemplación del practicante de oración de los eventos de la historia de la salvación narrados en las Escrituras. Las oraciones y los misterios que las acompañan permiten a quienes las rezan meditar sobre los acontecimientos de la historia de la salvación que ocurrieron en la vida de Jesús y María. Nuestra contemplación orante de las acciones de Dios mientras rezamos el rosario nos permite imitar la disposición de María de apertura a la voluntad de Dios (Lc 1:38) y la meditación continua de las acciones de Dios en su vida (Lc 2:19). Por lo tanto, el rosario es la devoción mariana por excelencia, ya que pretende inculcarnos la disposición misma de María, al encontrarla en el Evangelio y en nuestra oración.

Honremos a nuestra patrona celestial, Nuestra Señora del Rosario, que es Nuestra Señora de la Victoria, con una dedicación renovada al uso diario del rosario en nuestra oración.

True change happens when everyday people contribute to large movements.

You don't have to be famous, on TV, or have a huge online following to make a difference. It starts with the small step of believing the stories of survivors, and then committing to learn more about the problems facing those survivors and their children.

Every day you can be an advocate just by chatting with others at school, work, church, wherever. Let others know you care about domestic violence. Wear purple during Domestic Violence Awareness month in October. When you're asked what it's about, explain why you are concerned about domestic violence.

If someone says, "Well, why don't they just leave," respond with, "Why are the abuser's actions allowed to go unpunished?"

Misunderstandings about domestic violence are perpetuated because people simply accept them as the truth. Start a conversation that might lead to a changed mind.

You can let lawmakers know that protecting domestic violence survivors through strong and safe policy is important to you. When Archdiocese of Chicago Domestic Violence Outreach (ACDVO) sends you a call to action on pending legislation, you can reach out to your legislator.





**CRITERIA FOR
BEREAVEMENT MINISTRY**

- Will be recommended or approved by the parish pastor.
- Is a person of faith and a caring, compassionate individual.
- Will observe strict confidentiality regarding anything heard or observed in contact with a grieving client.
- Will be trained in bereavement ministry utilizing National Catholic Ministry to the Bereaved Training materials or other appropriate training.
- Will accept direction from clergy, liturgy coordinator, and music staff in developing authentic and dignified vigil, wake, and funeral services using the Order for Christian Funerals or other designated planning tool.
- Will work in close cooperation with the pastor, parish bereavement coordinator and other parish staff.
- Reflects serenity of soul, mind and heart in speech and action.
- Will have time and energy to dedicate support to those experiencing grief.
- Will refer grieving clients for professional help if required; always erring on the side of safety for the client.
- Will have resolved his/her own grief issues to a place where the needs of the grieving person are primary.
- Will voluntarily and temporarily withdraw from active ministry if he/she suffers a significant loss.
- Will care for his/her spiritual, physical, and emotional needs and be well-equipped to care for grieving clients.
- Will attend virtual or in-person enrichments as available for continuing education.
- Will annually discern with pastor or parish Bereavement coordinator his/her desire and ability to continue in this ministry.

For Pre-Marriage Preparation and to secure the wedding date you prefer, please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance before confirming a reception hall. Arrangements can be made at the Parish Office by the bride and groom.

COMMUNION, CONFIRMATION AND CONVERSION:

Children: All children should be enrolled in the Religious Education Program from first through eighth grades, if they are not in a Catholic School.

Adults: Please call the parish office to inquire about RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults).

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK: Anytime a person is facing a serious illness, surgery or hospitalization, it is proper to receive the Sacrament of the Sick. Please contact the parish office. If the office is closed, please leave a message or press option 5.

MINISTRY OF CARE - HOMEBOUND PARISHIONERS:

Please notify the parish office if there is someone you know who is unable to join us at Mass and would like to have the Eucharist brought to their home. Our Ministers of Care bring Holy Communion to those who are sick and homebound.

FUNERALS: When a family member dies, arrangements with the Church are usually made by the Funeral Home. Contact can also be made to the parish directly so priests and bereavement ministers may assist in planning the liturgy for the Funeral Mass, Wake Service and Final Commendation at the cemetery.

FIFTEEN YEARS OR SWEET SIXTEEN: Fifteen-sixteen year old young ladies who would like to celebrate their quinceanera should have been confirmed and received their First Holy Communion as well as a series of preparation for the celebration. Please call Mrs. Maria Arrez at the Office of Religious Education for details.

PRESENTATION OF A CHILD: When your child is 40 days or three years old, he/she may be presented in the church on the First Sunday of any month. Please call the parish office one week ahead to register your child.

GLUTEN FREE HOSTS: If you would like to receive a gluten free host, please notify the priest prior to the beginning of Mass so a gluten free host may be made available for you.

PREPARACIÓN SACRAMENTAL
