MESSAGE FROM FATHER MIKE




Dear Parishioners of Our Lady of the Rosary

As you know, in the Roman Catholic Church, we ordinarily observe January 1st as a Holy Day of Obligation, the Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God. However, this year, because January 1st falls upon a Monday, the obligation to attend Mass is “abrogated” or dispensed.

To honor Our Lady, we will offer Mass in both of our churches on the morning of January 1. At Saint Pascal church, Mass will be celebrated at 9:00 AM in English. At Saint Bartholomew, a bilingual Mass will be offered at 11:00 AM

The Solemnity of Mary Mother of God honors Our Lady for her motherhood of Jesus Christ, whom She had circumcised on the eighth day after His birth according to Levitical practice. In times past, January 1st was observed as the Feast of the Circumcision, to commemorate this event in the infancy of Jesus Christ. However, with the liturgical reforms inaugurated by the Second Vatican Council, it was decided to place the focus of the liturgical celebrations on the first day of the new civil year on the maternity of Our Lady.

The renewed title of the Solemnity of Mary Mother of God honors the title rightly bestowed upon our Blessed Lady at the Council of Ephesus in 431 AD. The original title in Greek that was enshrined at Ephesus was Theotokos, or “God bearer.” Some may find the Latin rendition of this title, “Mater Dei”, misleading, possibly giving the impression that Mary is Mother of the Holy Trinity. However, the Catechism tells us that Mary is the mother of the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity because neither the Father nor the Holy Spirit is incarnate. But the problem here may be deeper than just a confusion of persons within the Godhead. As one commentator notes, this simple explanation almost invariably leads to another question that reveals the real difficulty for many Protestant Christians: “even if Mary is only the mother of the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity, Jesus is just as eternal as the other two divine persons are. Thus, in order to be His mother, Mary would have to be equally eternal. Here, we find a false understanding of what is meant by Mary’s true motherhood and perhaps a false understanding of what is meant by motherhood in general.



By saying Mary is the Mother of God, our Catholic Church is not saying Mary is the source of the divine nature among the three persons of the Blessed Trinity, nor is she the source of the divine nature of the second Person. But she doesn’t have to be in order to be the mother of the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity incarnate. Mary did not provide Jesus with either His divine nature or His immortal human soul, but she is still His mother because she did not give birth to a body, a soul, a nature, or even two natures - she gave birth to one person, Jesus Christ who is both truly human and truly God.

Thus, Our Blessed Mother is properly called Mother of God. Although we are not obliged this year to attend Mass on her feast, I can think of no better way to honor the woman who is both God’s mother and ours!

Happy New Year! May our Eternal God, through the intercession of Our Lady, bestow upon you and those you love every grace and blessing in this new year of 2024!




Queridos feligreses de Nuestra Señora del Rosario

Como saben, en la Iglesia Católica Romana, normalmente observamos el 1 de enero como un Día Santo de Precepto, la Solemnidad de María, la Santa Madre de Dios. Sin embargo, este año, debido a que el 1 de enero cae en lunes, la obligación de asistir a Misa es "abrogada" o dispensada.

Para honrar a Nuestra Señora, ofreceremos Misa en nuestras dos iglesias en la mañana del 1 de enero. En la iglesia de San Pascal, la misa se celebrará a las 9:00 a.m. en inglés. En San Bartolomé, se ofrecerá una misa bilingüe a las 11:00 a.m.

La solemnidad de María, Madre de Dios, honra a Nuestra Señora por la maternidad de Jesucristo, a quien circuncidó al octavo día después de su nacimiento, según la práctica levítica. En tiempos pasados, el 1 de enero se observaba como la Fiesta de la Circuncisión, para conmemorar este evento en la infancia de Jesucristo. Sin embargo, con las reformas litúrgicas inauguradas por el Concilio Vaticano II, se decidió poner el foco de las celebraciones litúrgicas del primer día del nuevo año civil en la maternidad de Nuestra Señora. El título renovado de la Solemnidad de María, Madre de Dios, honra el título justamente otorgado a Nuestra Santísima Señora en el Concilio de Éfeso en el año 431 d.C. El título original en griego que se consagró en Éfeso era Theotokos, o "portador de Dios". Algunos pueden encontrar engañosa la traducción latina de este título, "Mater Dei, posiblemente dando la impresión de que María es la Madre de la Santísima Trinidad. Sin embargo, el Catecismo nos dice que María es la madre de la Segunda Persona de la Santísima Trinidad porque ni el Padre ni el Espíritu Santo están encarnados. Pero el problema aquí puede ser más profundo que una simple confusión de personas dentro de la Deidad. Como señala un comentarista, esta simple explicación conduce casi invariablemente a otra pregunta que revela la verdadera dificultad para muchos cristianos protestantes: "incluso si María es solo la madre de la Segunda Persona de la Santísima Trinidad, Jesús es tan eterno como lo son las otras dos personas divinas. Por lo tanto, para ser su madre, María tendría que ser igualmente eterna. La raíz de este problema de la "cuadrinidad" es una falsa comprensión de lo que se entiende por la verdadera maternidad de María y tal vez una falsa comprensión de lo que se entiende por maternidad en general.



Al decir que María es la Madre de Dios, nuestra Iglesia Católica no está diciendo que María es la fuente de la naturaleza divina entre las tres personas de la Santísima Trinidad, ni es la fuente de la naturaleza divina de la segunda Persona. Pero no tiene que serlo para ser la madre de la Segunda Persona de la Santísima Trinidad encarnada. María no le dio a Jesús ni su naturaleza divina ni su alma humana inmortal, pero sigue siendo su madre porque no dio a luz un cuerpo, un alma, una naturaleza, ni siquiera dos naturalezas: dio a luz a una persona, Jesucristo, que es verdaderamente humano y verdaderamente Dios. .

Por lo tanto, Nuestra Santísima Madre es llamada propiamente Madre de Dios. Aunque este año no estamos obligados a asistir a Misa en su fiesta, ¡no puedo pensar en una mejor manera de honrar a la mujer que es a la vez la madre de Dios y la nuestra!

¡Feliz Año Nuevo! ¡Que nuestro Eterno Dios, por intercesión de Nuestra Señora, os conceda a vosotros y a vuestros seres queridos toda la gracia y bendición en este nuevo año 2024!





The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

I remember the first time my older sister asked me if I wanted to hold her newborn son. Terrified, I told her I

didn't think it was a good idea. My résumé had nothing to suggest I would be a qualified baby holder. But she warmly told me, "I'll help you hold him." It struck me that she is baby's mother. She is the one who decides who is qualified to hold him. I took him in my arms and soon I began to feel comfortable with that tiny little warm cooing creature in my arms, and soon I no longer feared holding him. Now, twenty-seven nieces and nephews later, holding a newborn child is one of the great joys of my life.

Do we sometimes think that Jesus is given only to the highly qualified, special religious people? In the Gospel of Luke today we hear about the presentation of the Lord in the temple. The newborn son of God is passed around like a baton in a relay race, not guarded like a precious jewel or a breakable china dish. We can see him going from the arms of Mary to Joseph, then to the priest performing the ceremony, then to Simeon the old man, then to Anna the old widow. Each one receiving him and then handing him to the next. A tidal wave of joy and thanksgiving follows wherever he is placed.

Believe me, you are qualified to hold Jesus in your arms. How can I say that with such confidence? Because the mother decides who is qualified. The Blessed Virgin, embodied in the Church, holds him out to you and me. She rejoices to place him in our arms to hold, and to hand him on, too.



CONTEXT

Many people mistake our work for our vocation. Our vocation is the love of Jesus. — *Mother Teresa*

No vocation is born of itself or lives for itself. A vocation flows from the heart of God and blossoms in the good soil of faithful people. — *Pope Francis*

Everybody, no matter what vocation they're looking at, should add music as an essential to their curriculum. Music can be a very important part of your soul and your growth as a human being. It's so powerful. — *Quincy Jones*

WHY IT MATTERS

Each of us, through our Baptism, is called by God to follow the path of love. Our unique and particular response is our vocation. The church generally refers to four types of vocations: marriage, single life, holy orders, and religious life. It is up to each of us to discern the vocation that will give us the greatest sense of fulfillment and joy and lead us to holiness.

From the Catechism of the Catholic Church: The Beatitudes express the vocation of the faithful and shed light on the actions and attitudes characteristic of the Christian life (1717).

From Vita Consecrata: In the unity of the Christian life, the various vocations are like so many rays of the one light of Christ, whose radiance brightens the countenance of the Church.

FAITH IN ACTION

How does God call us to be bearers of Christ? We can start with offering Christ and all others the fullness of our love.

SACRAMENTAL PREPARATIONS

BAPTISMS: Registration in the parish is a prerequisite. Parents and godparents must attend a Pre-Baptismal Preparation Session with the celebrant two months prior to the Baptism either in person or Zoom. For details regarding baptismal registration and requirements, please contact the parish office or website.

RECONCILIATION: Every Saturday at 9:00 AM to 9:30 AM at Saint Pascal and Saint Bartholomew.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY: Either the bride, the groom, or parent of either must be a registered and active parishioner for at least six months before contacting the parish to make arrangements. For Pre-Marriage Preparation and to secure the wedding date you prefer, please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance before confirming a reception hall. Arrangements can be made at the Parish Office by the bride and groom.

COMMUNION, CONFIRMATION AND CONVERSION:

Children: All children should be enrolled in the Religious Education Program from first through eighth grades, if they are not in a Catholic School.

Adults: Please call the parish office to inquire about RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults).

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK: Anytime a person is facing a serious illness, surgery or hospitalization, it is proper to receive the Sacrament of the Sick. Please contact the parish office. If the office is closed, please leave a message or press option 5.

MINISTRY OF CARE - HOMEBOUND PARISHIONERS:

Please notify the parish office if there is someone you know who is unable to join us at Mass and would like to have the Eucharist brought to their home. Our Ministers of Care bring Holy Communion to those who are sick and homebound.

FUNERALS: When a family member dies, arrangements with the Church are usually made by the Funeral Home. Contact can also be made to the parish directly so priests and bereavement ministers may assist in planning the liturgy for the Funeral Mass, Wake Service and Final Commendation at the cemetery.

FIFTEEN YEARS OR SWEET SIXTEEN: Fifteen-sixteen year old young ladies who would like to celebrate their quinceañera should have been confirmed and received their First Holy Communion as well as a series of preparation for the celebration. Please call Mrs. Maria Arrez at the Office of Religious Education for details.

PRESENTATION OF A CHILD: When your child is 40 days or three years old, he/she may be presented in the church on the First Sunday of any month. Please call the parish office one week ahead to register your child.

GLUTEN FREE HOSTS: If you would like to receive a gluten free host, please notify the priest prior to the beginning of Mass so a gluten free host may be made available for you.
